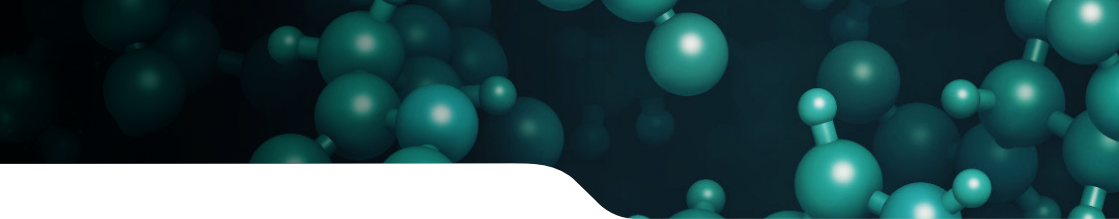

SANDRO LOCHE

Sandro Loche is former Head of the Pediatric Endocrinology Unit at the Pediatric Hospital Microcitemico in Cagliari (Italy). He received his medical degree at the University of Cagliari in 1979, training in Pediatrics and Endocrinology at the University of Cagliari and in Pediatric Endocrinology at the Cornell University Medical College, New York. His main areas of scientific interest include growth and growth disorders, neuroendocrine regulation of GH secretion, diagnosis and treatment of GH deficiency, childhood obesity. He has published over 200 articles, reviews and books. He has served as Editor of the Journal of Endocrinological Investigation and is currently associate editor of Frontiers in Endocrinology. He received the 2015 Cacciari Prize of the Italian Society for Pediatric Endocrinology and Diabetes (SIEDP/ISPED) for excellence in Pediatric Endocrinology. Sandro Loche is a member of many national and international pediatric and endocrine societies including the American Endocrine Society and the European Society for Pediatric Endocrinology and has served in many societies' committees over the years. He has been an invited speaker to numerous national and international meetings. He is currently a senior researcher at the Bambino Gesù Children Hospital. IRCCS, Rome, Italy.



ANTONIO DE ARRIBA MUÑOZ

Antonio de Arriba Muñoz is a paediatrician specialising in paediatric endocrinology who has focused his research on issues of adherence to growth hormone treatment and the use of new technologies for chronic endocrine diseases. He holds a PhD from the University of Zaragoza and works at the Miguel Servet University Hospital in Zaragoza, Spain.

He has authored over 50 impact-factor publications, focusing on growth hormone therapy adherence and the application of new technologies in paediatric care.



PAUL DIMITRI

Professor Paul Dimitri is a Consultant in Paediatric Endocrinology at Sheffield Children's NHS Foundation Trust. He is Professor of Child Health Technology at the University of Sheffield and Professor of Child Health at Sheffield Hallam University. Professor Dimitri is the Director of the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR) HealthTech Research Centre in Paediatrics and Child Health (<https://hrc-children.nihr.ac.uk>), and the Clinical Director for the National Technology Innovation Transforming Child Health (TITCH) Network (www.titch.org.uk). He was the previous Director of the NIHR Children & Young People MedTech Cooperative (NIHR CYP MedTech), the UK's first paediatric NIHR MedTech Co-operative. He is the Vice President for Science and Research at the Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health shaping the national research agenda and policy for child health across the UK through strategic partnerships. He was the NIHR National Children's Specialty Lead from 2016-2024 leading 15 networks to position the UK as a global leader in child health research. Professor Dimitri is leading on the development of the £24.4 million National Centre for Child Health Technology, a global first 42,000 ft² centre bringing together industry, universities, healthcare professionals, children and young people and their families to develop the most advanced healthcare technologies for children worldwide. Paul has led on the development and implementation of national technology networks that specifically focus on the development and deployment of technology for paediatrics and child health through private and public sector collaboration. These networks have leveraged over £55 million and supported around 200 projects to support the development of child health technology over the last decade. For his achievements, Paul was awarded NIHR Senior Investigator status in 2025. NIHR Senior Investigator status is a prestigious national award recognising the UK's leading researchers in applied health and care. Through a sustained focus on research, innovation, and technology, Professor Dimitri is committed to transforming the health and healthcare of children and young people ensuring that the delivery of meaningful, equitable, and lasting impact.
